It is either an initialization path, in which case the bug does not explain how this happened.

Either a non-issue, because it's a bad configuration. I resolved it on show.t.o by clicking edit on the bogus tracker and clicking save. The default listing configuration for the tracker contained garbage.

It could also be a much wider issue about Tiki never performing any serious validation.

As I wrote in the ticket 3 months ago, I had reproduced on show, and show is running PHP version 5.5.4-1~dotdeb.1 (not sure what show was running 3 months ago though)

From what I gather, it's an invalid value that is set correctly after re-saving. However, this will cause a lot of bug reports and unhappiness and user support so we need something more graceful.

Seems like a case of the "Observer effect", and I presume someone edited my previous configs and thus, the issue was no longer visible on show. Too bad nobody (including me) thought of using the snapshot feature 😊

Hi Marc,

Did you create the tracker on show by exporting the tracker from next and then importing into show? If that was the case you simply copied the problem from there. The problem is inherently in the way the tracker definitions are messed up on next.tiki.org

If you export the trackers from next.tiki.org you will naturally create the problem in wherever you import them as the problem is that the tracker defs are messed up on next.

So it is not a 12.x issue but rather something to do with the way next is created or something. Will have to discuss/investigate further with Oliver.

This problem was visible on next.tiki.org (which is pre-dogfood script data from tiki.org )

But at one point, Oliver made a change ( I think it was something about the encoding of the transferred text, maybe a setting change in db/local.php or something about the data in transit) and this solved the problem there. So I thought it was solved, but obviously it seems to only have masked the issue as other are getting this independently.

It could be OS / encoding / setting dependent...
