Description

Read and tried the various methods in the various (sometimes conflicting) MultiTiki documentation. Could not figure out a path to success.

It appears that (although it was claimed otherwise on some other pages) that shell access is required for MultiTiki.

Questions that came about during attempt at integration:

- (1) Is it possible to setup MultiTiki when one is on a hosted server (via FTP only)? If so, what is the process? I would be willing to write up the process if I could figure out how to do it.
- (2) Which of the MultiTiki's is supported for TikiWiki3 ?
- (3) Is there a web-based installer for setting up several tikiwikis on the same domain (but in different folders)?

How can I help vette the install process?

I would really like to setup an InterTiki + MultiTiki site as my corporate intranet. This would closely mimic the sub-web functionality in TWiki but allow for group wiki's to get their own distinct identity. At this point, TikiWiki is nearly more functional than TWiki, but the InterTiki/MultiTiki difficulties may be the deal breakers.

Solution

For reference, I'm uploading an image of the Intranet structure I am trying to achieve. I've currently got 2 demo TikiWiki's online (3.0 beta 3) and am trying to get them to play together. Both use Web auth, but I cannot get InterTiki to work. MultiTiki would be nice because it would seriously cut down on upgrade and maintenance time.

I would love to help back by documenting how it all worked out in the end. TikiWiki really would be my preferred solution (the file galleries and wysiwig editing and section editing make it a far more friendly wiki than TWiki is).

I'm agnostic regarding solution (TRIM vs MultiWiki), but do not currently have shell access. InterTiki sounds nice, but it would be far simpler if I could point to a single .htpasswd/.htgroup file for all user and group control.

So, how can I help with the TRIM or Workspace projects?

AFAICT, you are trying to do three things.

.htpasswd/.htgroup

MultiTiki

no shell

I suggest to isolate. I am not sure if shell is necessary.

1- Let's start by getting 2 independent Tikis to work with InterTiki, using Tiki standard authentication.

2- Once that works, let's get it to work with MultiTiki.

3- I don't see the advantage of .htpasswd/.htgroup compared to what InterTiki can do. But if you still want to go this way after 1 & 2, we can look at it 😊

Separating the issues is a better idea —

My dream would have been to do four things (.htpasswd/.htgroup > ~~InterTiki~~ > MultiTiki --> No shell)

focusing on MultiTiki:

I'm proud to say that the documentation for non-shell FTP setup of MultiTiki has been significantly

improved (see docs for ManualInstallation <http://doc.tikiwiki.org/tiki-index.php?page=Manual+Installation>). The documentation for Manuel Setup alone is excellent and we should consider this "bug" closed.

On the other pieces:

I have since learned much more regarding InterTiki and have upgraded the documentation and posted updates to those "bugs" as well.

Regarding Web authorization — I'm going to look into the code soem more and see if there are any contributions I can make on that front.
