Since this issue was reported, it's no longer a rename, but an alias.

In any case, it should not be automatic. It should be a step in the installer.

"Do you want tiki installer to make an alias from .htaccess to \_htaccess?"

On IIS, it's a different system than .htaccess

And on some Linux systems configs, this automatic change cause the install process to abort / fail.

In ClearOS, when creating a new website, "Follow Symbolic Links" defaults to off. So the installer fails and it's hard to figure out what happened. tiki-check.php doesn't provide hints.

tiki-install.php should be super robust and not do stuff that can break (especially in the background). And this stuff is not essential. Maybe the code in tiki-install.php related to htaccess should be moved to tiki-admin.php? And be an option / operation to rename \_htaccess or add an alias (two different options). This would provide the benefit that admins could have a warning explaining that this could cause issue, and what to do to revert.
