Only after doing a manual install and then going to the page of the installed tiki I get errors about DELETE permission not there. -> Checked DB permissions and it turns out yes that's it! My user didn't have the permissions to create or alter anything in the DB... simple mistake, but waaay too long troubleshooting.

The script should not ignore errors silently imho.

the least it could do is write a line saying something is wrong with your DB setup or something so one knows where to start to look.

Preferrably even check the permissions for the user \*before\* running the update script and telling the user he failed at setting correct DB permissions. (In general quickly testing if DB works and permissions are OK before trying to run the script would be good, especially since 2 queries require FULL permissions in the DB not just CREATE, ALTER,.. — I think some index and collate stuff)
