Good point, Marc, no idea (not enough experience with that field, after I bug that was affecting me in a production site many years ago, and I stopped relying on it since then - and I didn't follow up when it was fixed or whatever).

Regarding the use case we have in mind for a common client, they expect a user friendly and simple way for the technician to edit a tracker item (some fields, which might not necessarily be a text area/wikipage but some other info of several tracker fields with updated values, and expecting to get some way to tell them that they need to read it, and to get a status changed after they did read it). If that can be automatic (automagic change status to "read" when url visited) great, so that they do not need to go to tedious editing of each tracker item by hadn to "say" I've read this.)

Is that clearer then why the feature request as such?

(after my explanation I see clearer that tracker field wiki page might not serve as is for this use case, but some development of some sort will be needed, to extend the wiki page tracker field type to support the "must read" feature or by some other means)

Hello,

Are you aware of the "Terms and Conditions" introduced in Tiki 13

(<https://doc.tiki.org/Terms+and+Conditions>)

It look to me there are related and similar point or related use case.

While "Terms and Conditions" is focused on single Wiki page reading, the system may be extended to work with several and different object (wiki page, trackeritems, file, image, etc).

On the other end if you have more advanced code underway and it can replace the actual "Terms and Conditions" then why not use it instead.

If we can avoid having 2 feature doing "almost" the same thing for a single feature with several options I vote for that. 😊

Thanks Bernard, good point, but different use case than Terms and conditions. This about adding new work orders to a tracker, and technicians working on them, plus updating some info, and requiring another department in their business to confirm that they read those updates to the tracker items.
