Description

It is very hard to ask questions here. (

(Drop down choices rarely match my conditon, this isn't a bug as far as I know, I just need more information)

I am using Tiki Wiki 17. (was not available to choose from, above).

I am trying to copy a .bsa file to my file gallery: www.projectashenfire.org/home/cms/tikiwiki/tiki-list_file_gallery.php?galleryId=11

Small .bsa files can be dragged and dropped into the tiki upload menu. 575M .bsa files fail to be uploaded

When I first attempted this, I was using Tiki 16.2, and I was not getting any error messages.

So, I upgraded to Tiki groupware 17.

I now get a consistent error message using Chrome, Opera, Firefox, Comodo, Safari) When uploading, I get this message AJAX: error 0 (rejected) for URL: tiki-ajax services.php?controller=file&action=upload multiple

AJAX. error o (rejected) for one. tiki-ajax_services.php:controller=mccaction=apload_mate

What do I do to resolve this, so any user can upload large files to my site?

I have googled the error message but nothing shows.

I have used the forums and faqs on this site to verify no other conditions are required to handle large files in the file gallery.

I have contacted my worthless tech support and they say it is your issue.

My php.ini settings all look like this: allow_url_fopen = Off allow_url_include = Off asp_tags = Off display_errors = Off enable_dl = Off file_uploads = On max_execution_time = 90 max_input_time = 90 max_input_vars = 1000 memory_limit = -1 session.gc_maxlifetime = 1440 session.save_path = "/var/cpanel/php/sessions/ea-php56" upload_max_filesize = 1G post_max_size = 1G

After all the troubleshooting, I ended up using php 5.6(native).

I need to know what is going on?

Also, I used the 'contact us' button on your main site to query why my login does not work unless I use 'forgot password' EVERY time. Only on dev.tiki.org, does it work pefectly.

Workaround

Ajax error no longer appears. Same problem (can't upload large files), different, generic error. Closed. Reopen in new ticket

Like I said in my post, I have tweaked all of my php.ini files. I even had my execution time up to 200, unlimited memory. Also I can FTP the same file, but I am not sure if the parameters apply to ftp or not.

I already read that page you mentioned, thus giving me help on what to expect on my php ini editor. I have a multiple php editor that my tech support changed the parameters themselves. They told me it only works

in native mode.

So I left it like that and noted where the location of the php.ini was, that was listed in the native mode editor.

They won't tell me what the ajax error does.

I installed perl ajax_html module and the symptoms changed where the upload actually got to 100% then

gave an error 'internal server error'

I told my tech support this, 18 hours ago, and they ignore my questions. I was wondering what I can do, or VERIFY

the correct perl / ajax / java modules are loaded.

How do I close this unresolved ticket? The symptoms have changed, there no longer is an Ajax Controller error.

I am now just getting a generic error saying the file upload failed.

This is the latest response from the CPANEL technician on my site:

Hello,

It appears that what is happening is that the content management system used to upload files needs correcting. When I uploaded a 600 MB zip file without error. the result was that a file was reported by the cms as the name, 'encoded.php.' The name of the file I uploaded was called bigfile.zip. The encoded.php file appears to have some obfuscated code, which might be a sign that it is malicious. I'd recommend checking through the plugins and themes installed for this cms to make sure that there isn't anything installed that might be affecting this uploading.

I tried telling them that the original file appears to be encoded for upload, STAYS encoded in the file library and is tracked by an INDEX and it is not malicious.
